

S&T Agency Budgets in the Obama Years


Percent change from FY 2008 levels, constant dollars


Federal Spending Since FY 2010

R&D Funding in the Obama Years




- While the President's requests were regularly unfulfilled, appropriators still found ways to fund research...when there was fiscal room
 - "All politics is local"
 - Competitiveness, health, energy independence, national security; individual legislator priorities
- However, still areas of particular disagreement, i.e.:
 - Climate science
 - Social science
 - Applied tech: energy, manufacturing
 - Duplication, role of government, waste, accountability, transparency

Estimated percent change from current year, inflation adjusted






Estimated percentage change from FY 2017 enacted levels, nominal dollars


