

Conflict of Interest and Conflict of Commitment

- Concerns:
 - Inter-agency inconsistency
 - Conflation of Conflict of Interest and Conflict of Commitment concepts and terminology

Activities

- Joint AAU, APLU, COGR response to <u>NASA NPRM on Conflict of Interest and Conflict of Commitment Policy</u> -- emphasizes the need for cross-agency consistency
- Upcoming publication Analyzing Personal Financial and Other Conflicts of Interest in Research Contexts Updates <u>Recognizing and Managing Personal</u> Financial Conflicts of Interest (2002)
 - Includes discussion of COI in the foreign influence arena
 - Complements <u>Principles for Evaluating Conflict of Commitment Concerns in</u> <u>Academic Research (Sept. 2021)</u>
- Continuing efforts to gain additional information on NSF changes to Significant Financial Interest definition


