Malign Foreign Talent Recruitment Program

Pre-Award

- Effective May 20, 2024
- Individuals who are party to an MFTRP are not eligible to serve as senior/key persons on a proposal.
- Senior/Key Persons must certify that they are not participating in an MFTRP.
- Organizations must certify that Senior/Key Persons have been made aware of the prohibition and have certified they are not a party to an MFTRP.

Post-Award

- Effective June 9, 2025
- PIs and co-PIs on an NSF award made on or after May 20, 2024 must complete an annual certification that they are not party to an MFTRP.
- PIs and co-PIs will be prompted to certify via Research.gov starting on July 9. 2025.
- Follow-on annual certifications will be tied to the date of the first award made on or after May 20, 2024.
- The MFTRP annual certification applies to PIs and co-PIs. An annual certification process for all senior/key personnel is under development.

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Foreign Financial Disclosure Reporting

2025 Reporting Period

- Proposed: July 1, 2024 August 31, 2025
- Updated: July 1, 2024 June 30, 2025

Submission Period

- 2024 submission period:
 - July 1, 2024 July 31, 2024
 - Grace period until September 3
- 2025 submission period:
 - September 1, 2024 October 31, 2025
 - No grace period

Public Reporting

- Opt-out mechanisms for sensitive information
- Privacy, privilege, confidentiality, or other interest exempt from public disclosure under federal law







Research on Research Security

Program Description (PD 25-275Y)

- Posted April 11, 2025
- No Deadline
- Proposals submitted by June 30 will be considered for FY 2025 funding.

Building a new research discipline, community of practice

- Conferences/Working Groups/EAGER/Planning Grants
- Advance understanding of the factors that influence research security
- Strategies to leverage and produce data, analysis, theory, and tools that inform decision-making

International Working Group

- Help guide the development of the global research community
- Establish mechanisms for collaboration, leveraging expertise, addressing shared concerns

Centralized Certification
